SUBJECT: Burnaby Writing Contest and the WORDS Publication

The school district, with the support of a few corporate sponsors, is once again pleased to be coordinating the annual Burnaby Writing Contest and this year's WORDS publication. The contest recognizes the best efforts of Burnaby's student writers, and is open to students in all grades. Each school is encouraged to participate.

Staff should be aware of the following criteria for submissions:

- All entries must be original work from students currently enrolled at your school. To this end, we have adopted the following directions from the Royal Commonwealth Essay Competition:
- "The writer may be advised on preliminary planning and on source material but guidance from teachers or families should go no further than this. It is the essence of the competition that the submissions are the sole effort of the writer and they should not be composed or corrected by any person other than the writer."
- All submissions must have been written during the current (2017 2018) school year.
 Noteworthy writing from any subject area (English or French) could be considered.
- The focus of the contest and the publication is excellence in writing.
- 'Secondary school entries will be accepted in the following categories:

Burnaby Writing Contest and the WORDS Publication Memo Page $2\,$

All entries must be suitable for general audience publication. Students may be asked to revise content for audience considerations before being published.

- Prose entries are limited to 500 words in length.
- Each school is asked to undertake a school-based pre-screening process before submissions are made for district-wide judging. A school-based committee should decide on which and how many entries from each category to submit. Please refer to the grade appropriate BC Performance Standards for Writing and keep in mind that the focus is on excellence.
- The total number of entries a school may submit must not exceed five per cent of the school's total student population. Please be reasonable.
- Submissions which have been previously published are noteligible.
- All entries should be word processed and must be thoroughly proofread and submitted in publishable form.
- A completed official cover sheet (attached) must be included with all submissions. Identifying
 information (student's name, grade and school) should be on the cover sheet only. Please ensure
 that the official cover sheet is used, and that cover sheet information is accurate and legible.

Students are required to sign the cover sheet which confirms that

- it is their original work
- they are aware it is being submitted as a contest entryand
- it may be published by the school district in WORDS.
- Electronic copy: Students whose writing is <u>selected</u> for publication will be expected to submit an
 electronic version.
- Secondary finalists will receive prizes. Only those chosen as finalists will have their work included
 in the WORDS publication.
- All entries are to be forwarded to Becca Kong at the District Administration Office no later than Thursday, February 15th, 2018.
