Our aim is for students to have a safe and successful school year. We would like to develop a strong partnership with you to help your teen focus on learning and being positively involved in the school. ## **General Information**

## School Fees

- Fees will be collected online using our School Cash Online system. Instructions as well as a link on how to access the School Cash Online is available to you on our school website (https://north.burnabyschools.ca). You may also visit the site directly at https://burnaby.schoolcashonline
- The basic School Activity Fee for all grades is \$30.00.
- The Graduation Dinner/Dance fee is \$130.00.
- The School Leaving Ceremony for Grade 12's is \$80.00 (which includes an academic cap, gown and two tickets).
- The Dry After Grad fee is \$50.00.
- The Student Yearbook is \$65.00 before December 31st; \$75.00 after January 1st until January 31st

### School Lockers and locks:

- Lockers will need to be shared with another student. A locker (with a lock) will be assigned. (Unfortunately students will not be able to share with a desired locker partner)
- All students that have signed up for a locker, as well as all grade 8 students will receive an email with locker details on Wednesday, September 4<sup>th</sup>

- Students should have their own lock for PE lockers.
- Locks can be purchased from the office, room 114 for \$9.00 each (including tax).

### Textbooks

• Subject teachers will issue textbooks during class time. They are issued free of charge. A charge is made when textbooks are lost or damaged.

### Please note:

- Students must return the same book they were issued by their teacher.
- Students who lose a text will be required to pay the full replacement cost of the book.
- Students who return texts that have been damaged will be charged the full replacement cost.

### Course Change Process:

Grade 8 students who require a course correction (e.g. missing course or incorrect course) must go to Student Services on Tuesday September 3<sup>rd</sup> to see their counsellor. Please note: only grade 8 students can see their counsellors on September 3<sup>rd</sup>.



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Grade 9-12 students must follow the Course Correction process outlined below:

The school will <u>not</u> accommodate course changes for the following reasons:

- Having a class in a different period
- Having a different teacher
- Being in a different class to be with different people (e.g. friends)

Counsellors will work with students about their schedule according to this priority:

- Students with incomplete schedules
- Students who failed or did not complete summer-school / online course
- Student who didn't receive their requested / alternate elective
- Deadline for course request change or correction is Friday, September 15th

## Student ID Cards

- Student photos will be taken on Thursday, September 12<sup>th</sup>.
- Photo retakes will be on Friday, October 18th.
- Photo packages can be ordered from the photographer.
- Student ID cards will be issued following photo day, when they become available from the photographer.

### Student Absences/ Attendance:

### Success Program

- Runs from 3:15 pm 4:00 pm, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday in the Connect Room
- Teachers from our Learning Support Services Department, along with a number of Peer Tutors, will be available to assist students with homework, tests, or assignments.
- Students may choose to go for help or may be assigned by their teacher to the Success Program to help them catch up missed work assignments, class work, and/or write tests.



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### **Tutorial Time and Flex Time**

- Sessions have been scheduled throughout the year from October to April for grade 8 students.
- Sessions run from 8:45 am 9:30 am on Wednesdays (see school calendar).
- Tutorial sessions provide time for students to get help with and work on core academic subjects and read to develop stronger literacy skills.
- Flex Time is time for students to have more ownership of their learning by choosing how to use their time at the beginning of each day. For example, students may opt to meet with a teacher for some extra help, for some enrichment opportunities, and/or to collaborate with some classmates on a class or extracurricular project. Teachers will be available at this time, but student attendance will not be taken as students will very likely move between different teachers and classrooms each morning. Note: It is mandatory for Grade 8 students to attend flex time.
